- 3 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 4 Good afternoon. My name is Bob Wilson.
- 5 I'm with the Office of the Solicitor, United States
- 6 Department of Labor. With me is Dave Steffey, an
- 7 investigator with the Mine Safety and Health
- 8 Administration. Today is August 14, 2010. We're here
- 9 to conduct the interview of Charles Athey.
- 10 First of all, Mr. Athey --- well, Terry,
- do you want to identify yourself for the record?
- 12 MR. FARLEY:
- 13 Yes. I'm Terry Farley, with the West
- 14 Virginia Office of Miners' Health, Safety and
- 15 Training.
- 16 MS. SPENCE:
- 17 And I'm Beth Spence with the Governor's
- 18 independent investigation.
- 19 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 20 Mr. Athey, the first thing we're going to
- 21 do is I'm going to ask you to face the court reporter,
- and she will swear you in.
- 23 -----
- 24 CHARLES ATHEY, HAVING FIRST BEEN DULY SWORN, TESTIFIED
- 25 AS FOLLOWS:

- 2 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 3 Terry is going to go through some
- 4 preliminary matters pertaining to the subpoena.
- 5 MR. FARLEY:
- 6 Mr. Athey, if you would, please, just
- 7 state your full name and mailing address and phone
- 8 number for the record.
- 9 A. Charles Athey,
- 10
- 11 MR. FARLEY:
- 12 Okay. Now, I need to enter as Exhibit
- One a copy of the subpoena that you received. Does
- that look like a copy of what you received?
- 15 A. Yes, sir.
- 16 MR. FARLEY:
- 17 Does that also look like your signature
- on the return receipt?
- 19 A. Yes, sir.
- 20 MR. FARLEY:
- 21 And that is Exhibit One, please.
- 22 A. Actually, my brother picked that up. He signed it
- for me.
- 24 MR. FARLEY:
- 25 All right. Good enough.

- 1 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 2 Do you want that as Exhibits One and Two?
- 3 MR. FARLEY:
- 4 Yes, please.
- 5 (Athey Exhibits One and Two marked for
- 6 identification.)
- 7 MR. FARLEY:
- 8 Also, in accordance with State law, you
- 9 are entitled to a \$40 witness fee, if you choose to
- 10 accept it, and you're entitled to 15 cents a mile for
- 11 each mile you traveled to this location and home for
- this interview, along with any of the toll fees. Do
- 13 you wish to receive those?
- 14 A. It don't matter. I guess.
- 15 MR. FARLEY:
- 16 It's up to you. If you do, after the
- interview we'll need you to quickly fill out a couple
- of forms that my attorney will help you with at the
- 19 conclusion of the interview.
- 20 A. I ain't worried about no money.
- 21 MR. FARLEY:
- 22 It's up to you, sir.
- 23 A. No. That's fine.
- 24 MR. FARLEY:
- 25 I'm just obligated to offer you that.

- 1 A. All right.
- 2 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 3 For the record, there are other
- 4 individuals in the room with MSHA and with the State
- of West Virginia. All members of the Mine Safety and
- 6 Health Administration Accident Investigation Team and
- 7 all members of the State Accident Investigation Teams
- 8 shall keep confidential all information that is
- 9 gathered during witness interviews. Everyone's
- 10 participation in this interview constitutes their
- 11 agreement to maintain this confidentiality.
- 12 Investigators and specialists have been
- assigned to investigate the conditions and
- 14 circumstances surrounding the fatalities that occurred
- at the Upper Big Branch Mine on April 5th, 2010. The
- investigation is being conducted by MSHA pursuant to
- 17 Section 103(a) of the Federal Mine Safety and Health
- Act and by the West Virginia Office of Miners' Health,
- 19 Safety and Training. As part of that investigation,
- we are interviewing witnesses, and we appreciate you
- 21 coming in and assisting us today.
- 22 You may have an attorney or a personal
- 23 representative with you today. Do you have an
- 24 attorney or a representative?
- 25 A. No, sir.

- 1 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 2 No?
- 3 A. No, sir.
- 4 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 5 Your identity and the content of this
- 6 interview will be made public at the conclusion of the
- 7 interview process and may be included in a public
- 8 report of the accident, unless you request that your
- 9 identity remain confidential. If you request
- 10 confidentiality, we will keep your identity
- 11 confidential to the extent permitted by law. In other
- 12 words, if a judge orders us to reveal your name or
- some other law, such as the Freedom of Information
- Act, requires that we reveal your name, we may do so.
- 15 Also, there may be a need to use any information that
- 16 you provide to us in other investigations or in
- 17 hearings concerning the explosion. Do you understand
- 18 your rights to request confidentiality?
- 19 A. Yes, sir.
- 20 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 21 Do you have any questions about that?
- 22 A. No, sir.
- 23 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 24 After the investigation is complete, MSHA
- will issue a public report detailing the nature and

- 1 the causes of the fatalities in the hope that greater
- 2 awareness about the causes of accidents can reduce
- 3 their occurrence in the future. Information obtained
- 4 through witness interviews is frequently included in
- 5 those reports. We've interviewed over 160 people.
- 6 We're going to be interviewing more people. We ask
- 7 that you not discuss your testimony with anyone. All
- 8 right?
- 9 A court reporter will be recording the
- 10 interview, so please speak loudly and clearly. If you
- do not understand the question asked, please ask that
- we rephrase the question. If you need to take a break
- at any time, just let me know and we'll go off the
- 14 record. I want to thank you in advance for your
- 15 appearance here. Your cooperation is important in
- making the nation's mines safer.
- 17 After we have finished asking questions,
- we'll provide you with an opportunity. If there's
- 19 anything else that you want to add to the record,
- 20 we'll give you that chance at the end. Also, if you
- 21 think of any additional information after the
- interview, you can contact Norman Page, who is MSHA's
- lead accident investigator, here at the Mine Academy.
- 24 And I'm giving you a letter right now which contains
- 25 the contact information for Mr. Page. It also

- 1 contains information concerning your rights as a miner
- 2 under the MINE Act. And you can find additional
- 3 information concerning your rights at MSHA's website,
- 4 which is www.msha.gov. Terry, is there anything else
- 5 that you wanted to add?
- 6 MR. FARLEY:
- 7 Yes. Mr. Athey, I'd like to advise you
- 8 on behalf of the Office of Miners' Health, Safety and
- 9 Training, that the West Virginia State Mining
- 10 Regulations also provides protection against
- discrimination for miners who participate in these
- investigative interviews. I'd like to pass along to
- 13 you some contact information from the West Virginia
- Board of Appeals. The Board hears complaints from
- 15 miners regarding any form of discrimination. And
- should you experience any problems, by all means,
- 17 contact the Board. I would caution you, should you
- 18 have a problem, you need to file the complaint within
- 19 30 days. Also you have my business card and the phone
- 20 number for Mr. Bill tucker, our lead investigator, if
- 21 we can assist you in any way.
- 22 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 23 Thank you. Mr. Athey, I remind you that
- you are under oath. I will turn the questioning over
- 25 to Dave Steffey.

- 1 EXAMINATION
- 2 BY MR. STEFFEY:
- Q. Please state your full name and spell your last
- 4 name.
- 5 A. Charles Athey, A-T-H-E-Y.
- 6 Q. Okay. And Charles, please state your address and
- 7 telephone number?
- 8 A.
- 9 Phone number is
- 10 Q. Okay. Are you appearing here today voluntarily?
- 11 A. I was subpoenaed.
- 12 Q. Has anybody made any promises concerning the
- 13 testimony you're about to give?
- 14 A. No, sir.
- 15 Q. Has anybody given you anything in exchange for the
- 16 testimony you're about to give?
- 17 A. No, sir.
- 18 Q. Has anybody made any threats?
- 19 A. No, sir.
- 20 Q. Has anybody else interviewed you concerning the
- 21 accident and your knowledge of the conditions in the
- 22 mine?
- 23 A. Massey's lawyers.
- Q. Okay. And when did that interview take place?
- 25 A. Oh, it was --- I think it was about two months ago

- 1 or a month ago.
- Q. Where did this interview take place?
- 3 A. Elk Run office.
- 4 Q. Elk Run office?
- 5 A. Yes, sir.
- 6 Q. Did they caution you about this interview?
- 7 A. I don't know if they did or not. I don't know if
- 8 they did.
- 9 Q. Do you remember any instructions they gave you
- 10 about this interview?
- 11 A. No. They might have said that I might have been
- called or you all was going to talk to us.
- Q. Did they ask to speak to you after you were
- interviewed here?
- 15 A. No, sir.
- 16 Q. Mr. Athey, how many years of mining experience do
- 17 you have?
- 18 A. A year and eight months.
- 19 Q. A year and eight months?
- 20 A. Yes.
- 21 Q. Would you please give us a description of your
- 22 coal mine employment history, just a brief
- 23 description?
- A. It's always been outby, just whatever.
- Q. Do you have any mining certifications?

- 1 A. No.
- Q. Is your entire work history with Massey?
- A. Since I've been in the mines, yes, sir.
- Q. Are you presently employed?
- 5 A. Yes, sir.
- 6 O. Where at?
- 7 A. Hunter Peerless.
- 8 Q. When did you start there?
- 9 A. Right --- it was the last part of April. I don't
- 10 remember exactly what date.
- 11 Q. Okay. What's your present job title?
- 12 A. Scoop man.
- Q. When was your first day of employment with the
- 14 Upper Big Branch Mine?
- 15 A. Is that counting when I was a contractor?
- 16 Q. Yeah. When did you start as a contractor?
- 17 A. It was in November, the first part of November.
- 18 O. November 2009?
- 19 A. '08.
- 20 0. '08?
- 21 A. No, I'm sorry --- yeah, it was '08.
- 22 Q. Okay.
- 23 A. No. It was 2009.
- 24 0. 2009?
- 25 A. Yeah, because I ain't been there --- December made

- 1 me a year.
- 2 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 3 Just so the record is straight, the
- 4 accident occurred in April of 2010.
- 5 A. '10, right. And I worked there December, that
- 6 December. December was a year for me.
- 7 BY MR. STEFFEY:
- Q. So December of '09 was a year for you?
- 9 A. Yeah. December of '09 was a year for me.
- 10 Q. So you started as a contractor in November of '08?
- 11 A. Yes, sir.
- 12 Q. When were you hired by the company? Were you
- 13 hired by the company in December?
- 14 A. December the 16th, I think.
- 15 O. Of 2008?
- 16 A. Yes, sir.
- 17 Q. Did you receive the Massey Initial Training?
- 18 A. Yes.
- 19 Q. When did you receive that?
- 20 A. The day before I started.
- Q. Okay. And what subjects did they cover?
- 22 A. Oh, gosh. They showed us --- took us in the
- trailer and, you know, turned the lights out and I
- quess --- I mean, it's been a year ago. I really ---.
- Q. Okay. And you said your job assignment at Upper

- 1 Big Branch was outby?
- 2 A. Yes.
- Q. Has that always --- was that your job assignment,
- 4 the first thing you started at Upper big Branch?
- 5 A. Yes, sir.
- 6 Q. What about when you were a contractor, what did
- 7 they have you doing?
- 8 A. The same thing, outby work.
- 9 Q. Did you receive any job training at Upper Big
- 10 Branch?
- 11 A. As in?
- 12 Q. Any task training?
- 13 A. Yes, sir, pretty much anything I went around.
- 14 Q. When you were working outby, what were you working
- 15 on?
- 16 A. When I first started, we just had set up the head
- for Four section, and we went up there and helped load
- 18 track. And I'm trying to think where we went after
- 19 that. I think we started doing the belt for the
- longwall.
- 21 Q. Okay.
- 22 A. And after we got done with the belt, with the
- longwall, we went down to the Glory Hole to clean it
- up for our sections and just odd jobs.
- Q. Your first day as a contractor there, where did

- 1 they take you in the mine?
- 2 A. I'm trying to think. I really ain't for sure. I
- 3 think we went --- I think we went to Four section to
- 4 set it up.
- 5 Q. Did you go anywhere else in the mine that day?
- 6 A. I think they took us --- showed us around and
- 7 showed us the airways or the escapeway and --- I
- 8 really ain't for sure. It's ---.
- 9 Q. I understand. What about escapeways? Did they go
- 10 over escapeways with you?
- 11 A. Yes, showed us --- of course, I think they showed
- us the map. And I think we went and walked out on
- 13 Three section. We walked the airway out from Three
- 14 section.
- 15 Q. What did they tell you about the escapeways?
- 16 A. Just to follow the green area and told us about
- the safety rope and ---.
- 18 O. Okay.
- 19 A. Told us as a red hat if something would happen, we
- 20 would --- one of them would take us out.
- 21 Q. Okay. Did you have your own spotter, methane
- 22 detector?
- 23 A. No, sir.
- Q. You didn't have one. Who had one?
- 25 A. Mike Kiblinger and Marvin Perdue.

- 1 Q. Who was Mike Kiblinger?
- 2 A. He was my mentor.
- 4 A. The one that trained us.
- 5 Q. Okay. What about now where you're working at, do
- 6 you have your own spotter now?
- 7 A. No, sir.
- Q. Are you qualified by MSHA to conduct methane and
- 9 oxygen deficiency checks?
- 10 A. I guess everybody is.
- 11 Q. When you were working outby at UBB, when you first
- 12 started there as a contractor, how many company people
- were with you in your group?
- 14 A. There was me and --- there was me, Erik, Marvin
- and Mike. That's --- probably about four of us.
- 16 O. And who had methane detectors?
- 17 A. Mike and Marvin.
- 18 Q. Did you ever see them use them?
- 19 A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Did the company give you any other kinds of
- 21 training?
- 22 A. Just whenever you hire in and annual training.
- 23 Q. All right. Now, you said how many people were
- 24 typically on your outby crew?
- 25 A. About four.

- 1 Q. Okay. And where did you guys typically work at?
- 2 A. Just really all over. Are you talking about as a
- 3 red hat or once I reached black hat?
- 4 Q. When you were a red hat and then later as a black
- 5 hat, any areas stand out in particular?
- 6 A. No, just the Four section because we helped set it
- 7 up, and the longwall belt.
- Q. What portal did you typically enter?
- 9 A. When I first started, it was the Performance side.
- 10 And they finally moved us over to the Ellis side.
- 11 Q. Did you ever have to travel through any equipment
- 12 doors?
- 13 A. The doors that open?
- 14 O. Yeah.
- 15 A. Uh-huh (yes).
- 16 0. Track doors?
- 17 A. Yeah. There was only a thousand of them in that
- 18 mines.
- 19 Q. Were these doors automatic or did they have to be
- 20 opened by hand?
- 21 A. I guess the first four sets was automatic and
- there was some that was automatic, but they was broke,
- so we had to open them up by hand.
- Q. What kind of shape were these doors in?
- A. Oh, they'd stick them in new and two or three days

- later they'd get ripped out. I don't know how many
- times we'd put them back.
- 3 Q. Why would they get ripped out?
- 4 A. The motors would hit them. The mantrips would hit
- 5 them. It was kind of on a downgrade, and them big
- 6 motors, they just don't stop on a dime.
- 7 Q. So you were going back to work on these things
- 8 very often?
- 9 A. Yeah. We would stop all the time and have to fix
- 10 them.
- 11 Q. Were they airtight, perform a good airlock?
- 12 A. No. There was a lot of times you would go down
- there and there was air coming through them. We would
- have to stop and put new block and plaster them.
- Q. Are you familiar with the equipment doors that
- 16 were at Break 78?
- 17 A. Yes, sir.
- Q. How often were you around those doors?
- 19 A. I'd go through them all the time, not every day,
- 20 but ---.
- Q. Were they automatic or did you open them by hand?
- 22 A. They was supposed to have been automatic, but we
- had to open them by hand.
- Q. What kind of condition were they in?
- 25 A. They stayed pretty rough.

- Q. When you would open those doors at Break 78, could
- 2 you feel any changes in the air? Could you describe
- 3 to me what you felt?
- 4 A. Well, as long as they all were shut, not really.
- 5 Q. But when you opened them?
- 6 A. Well, if you opened the first set, the other set
- 7 was shut.
- 8 Q. Yeah.
- 9 A. And then it just ---.
- 10 Q. When you opened the first set, could you feel any
- 11 change in airflow?
- 12 A. No.
- 13 Q. No. Did you ever find them open?
- 14 A. Yeah. There for a while they was --- as we all
- started going in, the mantrips wasn't --- would be
- another mantrip would leave them open right in front
- of us. But I mean, if it was just one mantrip, no.
- Q. So they would leave them open if there were
- 19 several mantrips ---
- 20 A. Coming in behind.
- 21 Q. --- going in? What about when you were coming
- out, would they leave them open then?
- 23 A. If there was a mantrip in behind them. Then they
- 24 all got in trouble. I think Everett about fired a
- 25 whole crew for leaving them open.

- 1 Q. Did the section crews, the headgate crew, the
- 2 tailgate crew, did they quite at about the same time?
- 3 A. I ain't for sure what time the tailgate --- the
- 4 longwall crew quit, but the section crew quit pretty
- 5 much on time, the same time every day.
- 6 Q. Okay. So both section crews, did they come out
- 7 back to back and go in?
- 8 A. I ain't for sure how they would do it.
- 9 Q. Okay. Any other doors in the mine that you found
- 10 open?
- 11 A. No. I guess they left them all open at one time,
- 12 you know.
- 13 Q. What about --- let's come down here to the Ellis
- 14 Portal. You turn out here left hand and go out toward
- what was going to be the mini-panel. Were you ever
- 16 over in there?
- 17 A. Yes, sir.
- 18 O. What were you over in there for?
- 19 A. We was setting up for the new panel or longwall,
- whatever they was going to do over there.
- 21 Q. Okay. There's a row of stoppings right here just
- 22 prior to where the headgate for the new mini-panel was
- to turn off coming across here. You had a regulator,
- 24 a stopping and two sets of equipment doors. Can you
- 25 tell me what kind of shape these stoppings were in?

- 1 A. I think these were Kennedy panels we stuck in.
- Q. They were? What kind of shape were they in?
- 3 A. Pretty decent.
- 4 Q. Any holes in them?
- 5 A. No, because I sealed them good, me and Marvin.
- 6 Q. What about these equipment doors right here?
- 7 A. They was --- if I think where them are at.
- Q. Now, these are the most inby set, this down here.
- 9 A. This was ---.
- 10 Q. Now, there's two more sets up here.
- 11 A. I don't know if few went down this far.
- 12 Q. You don't know if you went down that far?
- 13 A. No. But we stuck --- we stuck some Kennedy panels
- in that went straight across.
- 15 Q. This track that runs down through here ---.
- 16 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 17 And just so the record's clear, we're
- talking about an area just outby the short longwall
- 19 projected panel.
- 20 A. We stuck some --- I was the one that stuck the
- 21 Kennedy panels in. It was my crew. I just don't
- remember them doors being there. I mean, I could be
- 23 wrong, but I just don't remember the doors being
- there. I was thinking we stuck Kennedy panels all the
- 25 way across it.

- 1 BY MR. STEFFEY:
- Q. There is a set of doors there. Now, there's track
- 3 that runs through here and it runs under these doors.
- 4 Do you know how far over in here this track goes?
- 5 A. No.
- 6 Q. Were you ever over in this turn over here?
- 7 A. Because on this side we went down. If this is UBB
- 8 --- or LBB. Is this LBB? Yeah. If this is LBB, we
- 9 went down when I first started and pulled some track
- 10 out.
- 11 Q. Okay. Back up here toward Ellis Portal, where the
- 12 first turnoff left handed going toward that mini-
- panel, there's two sets of doors here.
- 14 A. Right.
- Q. What can you tell me about these doors? Did you
- 16 ever work in this area?
- 17 A. Yes, sir.
- 18 MR. STEFFEY:
- 19 Can I have a blue marker?
- 20 BY MR. STEFFEY:
- 21 Q. Would you circle this area for me and indicate
- 22 that area that you worked in?
- 23 WITNESS COMPLIES
- 24 BY MR. STEFFEY:
- Q. Thank you.

- 1 MR. STEFFEY:
- 2 The record would indicate that he marked
- 3 the area that he worked in with a blue marker just
- 4 inby the Ellis Portal.
- 5 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 6 And why don't you, off from the side
- 7 here, write area worked.
- 8 WITNESS COMPLIES
- 9 A. See, these doors was pretty decent. They was ---
- 10 I think they was E set, and then they used to have a
- double stopping. If I'm write, we tore that out and
- 12 put these doors in. I remember.
- 13 BY MR. STEFFEY:
- 0. There's a set of doors there.
- 15 A. Yeah. There was a double stopping that we tore
- out and put some doors there.
- Q. Now, were you on the crew ---?
- 18 A. They was new doors.
- 19 Q. Now, were you on the crew that was cutting the
- 20 belt channel?
- 21 A. I wasn't on the crew. I was up there.
- 22 Q. You was up there?
- 23 A. Yeah.
- Q. Were you up there when they were cutting the belt
- 25 channel?

- 1 A. Yeah. Are you talking about the overcasts?
- 2 O. Yeah.
- 3 A. Yeah, I was up there.
- 4 Q. Why did they have --- leave their mantrip parked
- 5 inby and then block it in there when they were cutting
- 6 the belt panel?
- 7 A. I have no idea, because we usually just walked in.
- 8 I mean, my crew, when we was working right there, we
- 9 usually just walked in.
- 10 Q. Did you ever see them just prop these doors open
- 11 when they were working right in here?
- 12 A. I ain't never saw them doors.
- 13 Q. The first set of double doors?
- 14 A. No. They would always open the first door and
- 15 park their mantrip in here and close them. I never
- saw them open. Now, these doors I have.
- 17 Q. Never saw them propping them open with block or
- 18 anything?
- 19 A. No.
- Q. When these doors were open in here, what could you
- 21 tell me about this air direction? Could you feel the
- 22 air direction change?
- 23 A. You know, I really ain't for sure. I mean, I know
- when I went in the day of the explosion --- that
- 25 morning, the air was going down the track.

- 1 Q. So air was going in?
- 2 A. Yeah, it was all going down the track, because I
- 3 had to go shovel belt that day.
- 4 Q. Which way did the air normally go?
- 5 A. It came out of the return. I think it came up and
- 6 around and went out the ---.
- 7 Q. So the air in your belt air course and everything
- 8 went out?
- 9 A. Yeah. Yeah. And then when I went in Monday
- 10 morning, it all was coming down the track?
- 11 Q. At Ellis Portal?
- 12 A. Yeah.
- Q. Now, there was a vent supplement submitted to
- MSHA, and it was subsequently approved, showing how
- they were going to do ventilation in this area. Did
- anybody ever go over those vent supplements with you?
- 17 A. No, sir.
- 18 Q. Did anybody ever go over the ventilation plan at
- 19 all with you?
- A. No, sir. I was just told to go build stoppings.
- They marked them for me, and that's what I did.
- Q. You know, the law says that they're supposed to go
- 23 over any vent changes with all affected persons?
- A. No, I didn't know.
- 25 Q. Did anybody ever ---

- 1 A. No.
- Q. --- tell that to you?
- 3 A. No.
- 4 Q. Well, there was a vent supplemented submitted for
- 5 this area, and it consisted of several parts. And
- 6 that was what you all were working under right there.
- 7 No one ever covered that with you or your crew?
- 8 A. No. See, I --- we couldn't figure out why they
- 9 stuck doors here and then I think right over here on
- 10 the next thing they stuck another set of doors.
- 11 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 12 And you're pointing to the doors ---
- 13 A. On the track.
- 14 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 15 --- towards the Ellis Portal, outby that
- 16 crossover area where you were working?
- 17 A. Yeah. We stuck another set of doors in that was
- on the tracks.
- 19 BY MR. STEFFEY:
- 20 Q. Did you ever find these doors open?
- 21 A. They stayed open.
- 22 Q. They stayed open?
- 23 A. Yeah.
- 24 Q. Okay.
- 25 A. And then there was another set I guess a break,

- 1 maybe two breaks over, that we stuck in and they
- 2 stayed open.
- Q. These doors were open when I made this area.
- 4 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 5 Just to clarify, you've been talking
- 6 about the work going on in the area that you marked as
- 7 area worked. What was the time period that you were
- 8 working in that area?
- 9 A. I guess about a month because we just started up
- 10 there. I mean, I guess that last month, bringing
- 11 equipment up there. It might have been a little bit
- before that because we had --- like I said, we went
- down there and built all of these stoppings and ---.
- 14 BY MR. STEFFEY:
- Q. Is this the area that you were working in just
- 16 prior to the explosion?
- 17 A. Yes, sir. Well, the day of the explosion I was
- 18 shoveling belt on Four Head.
- 19 O. Where is Four head?
- 20 A. That's down here somewhere.
- Q. So it's between Ellis Switch and Ellis Portal?
- 22 A. Right. Right.
- 23 Q. Okay. Were you in the mine at the time of the
- 24 explosion?
- 25 A. No, sir. I just walked out.

- 1 Q. Okay. Let's come back to this area right here,
- 2 the area that you got circled as area worked, because
- 3 I'm real interested in this. Now, how long were you
- 4 guys over in here did you say?
- 5 A. About a month.
- 6 O. About a month?
- 7 A. Yeah, before they started bringing equipment and
- 8 actually cutting.
- 9 Q. And who all was on your crew?
- 10 A. Me and Marvin Perdue and Tattoo, I don't know his
- real name, they called him Tattoo, and Dennis Simms.
- 12 Q. Okay.
- 13 A. A lot of times Wayne Persinger would come down and
- 14 help.
- Q. Who brought the supply motor and the flatcar in
- and left it parked between the doors?
- 17 A. I don't know for sure.
- 18 O. You're not for sure on that?
- 19 A. No, I have no idea.
- 20 Q. Okay. Do you remember when you were walking out
- 21 from Four Head inby this point seeing these doors
- open? Do you remember looking over and noticing that?
- 23 A. I'm trying to think because that's where I kept
- their toolboxes at. No. No, because I walked up the
- 25 track and over a little bit to find Marvin.

- 1 Q. So was Marvin Perdue working in this area on this
- 2 day?
- 3 A. I ain't for sure where he was working at that day.
- 4 Q. Do you remember ---?
- 5 A. Because that was --- we first came in and he told
- 6 me Everett was going to come and get me. I had to go
- 7 with him.
- 8 Q. But he was the boss over this crew?
- 9 A. No, he was not the boss.
- 10 Q. Okay. Who was the boss over this crew?
- 11 A. I guess Wayne. Nobody really. They'd just give
- us our --- tell us what to do and you'd go do it.
- Q. You had how many men on your crew that day?
- 14 A. It was me and Marvin and Dennis Simms and Tattoo.
- 15 I don't know his --- I just know him by Tattoo.
- 16 O. Who was the foreman?
- 17 A. Terry Moore.
- 18 Q. Did any of you guys have a methane detector?
- 19 A. I never had one.
- 20 Q. Anybody else have one?
- 21 A. I think Marvin always kept his.
- 22 Q. Okay.
- 23 A. And actually, I think Dennis had one.
- Q. When you were underground that day, were you near
- a mine phone?

- 1 A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Okay.
- 3 A. Because about two o'clock I heard them --- kept on
- 4 --- I think it was Dino talking to somebody outside
- 5 and saying something kept on phasing out on the box,
- 6 power box. It was about two o'clock because I was
- 7 waiting on --- deciding on whether I should have
- 8 walked out or not.
- 9 Q. Did you hear anything else that day?
- 10 A. No.
- 11 Q. Anything out of the ordinary?
- 12 A. No. That was it.
- Q. Was there ever any call out saying they had
- methane or somebody's spotter was over range?
- 15 A. No, not that I heard.
- 16 Q. Okay. So you were around the belt head about two
- 17 o'clock and you heard Dino call out, saying that
- 18 something was what?
- 19 A. Kept on phasing out.
- 20 Q. Kept on phasing. Did you ever find out what that
- 21 was?
- 22 A. No. I have no idea.
- 23 Q. Do you know if they had been having any problems
- 24 on that section that day ---
- 25 A. No.

- 1 Q. --- other than that?
- 2 A. No.
- Q. What about ventilation problems inside this mine,
- 4 what can you tell me about those? Do you remember
- 5 ever having any?
- 6 A. No. I mean, as far as I know, it was normal. I
- 7 don't know how all that stuff works. I mean, I
- 8 couldn't tell you. But I do --- the only reason I
- 9 knowed that the air was moving wrong that day coming
- down the track because they were cutting and you could
- 11 see all the dust. And Everett come and got me and
- 12 told me he needed me to shovel belt.
- 13 Q. Where were they cutting at?
- 14 A. In here somewhere. They was cutting over to the
- 15 belt drive.
- 16 Q. Cutting a belt channel?
- 17 A. Yeah.
- 18 Q. And you could see the dust on the track?
- 19 A. Yeah, you could see it because I was sitting here,
- 20 hesitating, waiting on it to clear up to walk down
- there to Four Head.
- 22 Q. Okay. Do you remember any other air
- 23 reversals, ---
- 24 A. No.
- 25 Q. --- any other air was --- had changed?

- 1 A. No.
- 2 Q. Okay. So you --- I kind of jumped ahead here, but
- 3 it kind of led us this way. We'll come back to some
- 4 other stuff, though. What were the roof and rib
- 5 conditions like? What can you tell me about them?
- 6 A. It was pretty good, I guess. I mean, nothing
- 7 major I don't quess.
- 8 Q. Did you ever see any methane bubbling up through
- 9 the water here? Any water in that area?
- 10 A. Well, yeah, there was water, but I didn't pay
- 11 attention to that stuff.
- 12 Q. Never seen anything bubbling through?
- A. No, at other places in the mines, but I don't
- 14 remember seeing anything up there.
- 15 Q. Okay. But you had seen it at other places?
- 16 A. Yes, sir.
- 17 Q. Where were those other places; do you remember?
- 18 A. I'd say one of them was One section, because I was
- 19 down there helping them --- I went down to help Ron.
- 20 He was scooping, and I had to go down there to get the
- 21 scoop.
- Q. Now, where is One section?
- 23 A. A new section they was cutting. Yeah, I think it
- was over here.
- Q. Now, you had the tailgate section, the headgate

- 1 section and the longwall.
- 2 A. Okay. Well, maybe I'm wrong. It was this one
- 3 right here.
- 4 Q. And that's the headgate?
- 5 A. Yeah.
- 6 Q. And that was where Dino's crew was working?
- 7 A. I think, yeah. The other crew was working on the
- 8 other side.
- 9 Q. Okay. All right. So you saw some methane
- 10 bubbling up up in here?
- 11 A. Well, that's --- they said that's what it was.
- 12 Q. Okay.
- 13 A. One of the old boss foremans, I went with him, and
- we went to check the pumps when I first started. He
- said it was more than likely methane bubbling up, so I
- 16 guess that's what it was.
- Q. Did anybody ever seem alarmed by this methane
- 18 bubbling up?
- 19 A. If that's what it was, no.
- Q. Did anybody ever say if it got worse?
- 21 A. No.
- Q. What about the tailgate section, were you ever
- over on the new tailgate section?
- A. Maybe about a week --- this is Head's crew, ain't
- 25 it?

- 1 Q. I'm not sure. I know that's the new tailgate.
- 2 A. That's the new one. Yeah, I've been over there a
- 3 couple times.
- 4 Q. What can you tell me about it?
- 5 A. I'm trying to think what we done down there. We
- 6 had to go over there and build some stoppings, so I
- 7 was working with Terry Moore on the evening shift.
- 8 Q. What did you have to build the stoppings for?
- 9 A. And some overcasts. I guess they was doing an air
- 10 change.
- 11 Q. When was this?
- 12 A. I guess it was a couple --- about three weeks
- maybe during --- before all that happened.
- Q. Okay. How often did they make air changes in this
- 15 mine?
- 16 A. It's hard telling about them. I mean, we was
- always building stoppings or doing the overcasts.
- 18 Q. They never told you why, though?
- 19 A. No. I didn't ask them. I just do what I'm told.
- 20 Q. What about the longwall, were you ever around the
- longwall any?
- 22 A. Yeah, a little bit. I mean, not a whole lot. Not
- around the wall itself. We went behind the wall.
- Q. You went behind the wall. What were you doing
- 25 back there?

- 1 A. They was trying to save the return.
- 0. Crib it?
- 3 A. Crib, pins and ---.
- 4 O. What was that like back there?
- 5 A. It got kind of eerie sometimes. You would be
- 6 working there one day and come back and all your
- 7 supplies would be covered up the next day.
- 8 Q. So the top was bad?
- 9 A. Yeah, and the sides was bad.
- 10 O. Sides was --- the ribs were bad?
- 11 A. Yeah.
- 12 Q. What about the floor, did you ever see ---?
- 13 A. I didn't stick around long enough to see it.
- 0. What about water?
- 15 A. There was some down there, yeah.
- 16 Q. How deep did it get?
- 17 A. Without them pumps, I guess it was chest deep.
- 18 O. Did it ever roof out?
- 19 A. No, I never saw it.
- 20 Q. Never saw it?
- 21 A. No.
- 22 Q. What about on the tailgate side, were you ever
- 23 over on the tailgate?
- 24 A. No, sir.
- Q. What about going out toward the Bandytown fan?

- 1 A. That new fan?
- Q. Yeah, the new big fan out ---?
- 3 A. We've been out there. I helped them build the
- 4 stoppings and stuff for the fan.
- 5 Q. Okay. When did you build the stoppings out toward
- 6 Bandytown?
- 7 A. I don't remember exactly, just whenever they first
- 8 stuck it in until they turned it on. Well, it was
- 9 Kennedy panels. Kennedy panels.
- 10 Q. Can you remember approximately when you build
- 11 those Kennedy panels?
- 12 A. I guess in 2009 sometime.
- Q. Do you remember problems with methane or water out
- 14 through there?
- 15 A. I think they had some water, yeah, because they
- had a big old --- I guess ditch or something dug where
- they took the miners and ---.
- 18 O. How was the roof out there?
- 19 A. Pretty good as far as I could tell. I didn't
- 20 notice ---.
- 21 Q. Was there any work going on around the Bandytown
- 22 fan just prior to the explosion?
- 23 A. I have no idea. I don't know.
- Q. Don't know. Didn't hear of anything. Okay.
- Let's come back to this area right here, the headgate

- 1 area where you were working and you came back and the
- tools would be covered back up the next day. Did you
- 3 all ever report any concerns to management outside?
- 4 A. I didn't. Like I say, I just --- I mean, I was
- 5 new at it. I didn't, you know, know.
- 6 Q. Did you have to build any Kennedy panels or
- 7 anything up through here?
- 8 A. Yeah, about 26 breaks long, straight run.
- 9 Q. Straight run of Kennedy panels, huh? What was the
- 10 purpose of that?
- 11 A. Something to do with the air. That's all they
- 12 said.
- 13 Q. Okay. So you were knocking stoppings a lot and
- 14 building stoppings?
- 15 A. Yeah, just different --- shoveling belt.
- 16 Q. Shoveling belt. Now, where all did you shovel
- 17 belt at in the mine?
- 18 A. Mainly Ellis punch-out.
- 19 Q. Mainly Ellis punch-out. Did you ever shovel ---?
- 20 A. Yeah. I had to go down to 42 Break and shovel
- 21 that one, and then we had to --- I had to --- I guess
- the last week prior to the explosion we shoveled it
- and then me and Everett went down and dusted he whole
- belt. We was dusting the whole beltline.
- 25 Q. And how did you dust the beltline?

- 1 A. We had just one of them pumps that you pour dust
- 2 in.
- Q. And how much dust did you use that day?
- 4 A. Oh, gosh. I guess it was Monday to Saturday, and
- 5 then the next --- well, it was Monday through
- 6 Thursday, and then we had Easter break, and I thought
- 7 that's what we was going to go do because he came and
- got me again and told me he needed me to shovel belt.
- 9 O. How often were the belts rock dusted?
- 10 A. I ain't for sure. I mean, when I shoveled belt, I
- 11 would rock dust every day.
- 12 Q. Did you ever have any areas along the belt that
- were black, float dust or anything like that?
- 14 A. No. I mean, just from coal and stuff, I guess.
- 15 Q. So you just mainly spent your time shoveling loose
- 16 coal and ---?
- 17 A. Yes.
- 18 Q. Did They have any track-mounted dusters or
- 19 anything like that?
- 20 A. They had one that ran at night, I think.
- 21 Q. And how often did they use that?
- 22 a. I think at least once a week I saw it going up and
- 23 dusting.
- Q. Did they have their own dust crew or ---?
- 25 A. Yes, sir. They had two guys on --- one on a motor

- 1 and one just throwing dust.
- Q. Did they keep them all --- do you know who those
- 3 guys were?
- 4 A. No. I know they fired two. And I think --- I
- 5 think Clifford and Stewart was on the last part. We
- 6 all worked together and they split us up.
- 7 Q. So they had two, they fired them, is that what I
- 8 understood you ---?
- 9 A. For sleeping.
- 10 Q. For sleeping. So who did the rock dusting after
- 11 that?
- 12 A. I think Clifford and Stewart on the motor. I
- don't know what he used to do.
- 14 O. What did Clifford do?
- 15 A. Well, when he left --- he was down there with us
- because we worked down toward the Glory Hole cutting
- out the head for the new longwall over here, and we
- 18 just --- whatever they told us. We would bolt. We
- 19 would run scoop. They stuck us all up here. And I
- think they stuck him on the hoot owl. I think.
- 21 That's what --- I ain't for sure, but I think that's
- 22 what he --- they stuck him doing.
- Q. Okay. Were you ever in this Glory Hole area over
- 24 here?
- 25 A. Yes, sir.

- 1 Q. What can you tell us about that?
- 2 A. As in?
- 3 Q. What type of conditions were there?
- 4 A. It was pretty decent. We went down and cleaned it
- 5 up, you know, to get all the stuff off the ribs and
- 6 putting in doors and ---.
- 7 Q. Was the hole sealed when you were working over
- 8 there?
- 9 A. Yes, sir. You mean, the --- just I guess the
- 10 scoop --- the chute that the coal fell down into,
- 11 yeah.
- 12 Q. So it was sealed off and sealed up?
- 13 A. No, it wasn't --- I mean, it just had --- it still
- 14 had the belt head and stuff.
- 15 O. Still had the belt head?
- 16 A. Yes, sir.
- 17 Q. Was there air moving going up or down it?
- 18 A. I ain't for sure. I never ---.
- 19 Q. Okay. What about up here in what they call the
- 20 Eight North area, were you ever up in there?
- 21 A. Just a couple times. I went up there twice, I
- 22 guess, with Terry Moore when he was fire bossing.
- 23 Q. So you went up there with him while he was fire
- 24 bossing; right?
- 25 A. Yes, sir.

- 1 Q. Did you find anything?
- 2 A. No, sir.
- 3 Q. No hazards?
- 4 A. No, sir.
- 5 Q. Did you detect any methane?
- 6 A. No, sir.
- 7 Q. What about air movement?
- 8 A. I mean, it just, I guess, felt normal.
- 9 O. Felt normal?
- 10 A. Yeah.
- 11 Q. Did you see him take an air reading?
- 12 A. No. I don't know if he did that night because the
- 13 normal fire boss had called in.
- Q. What about ventilation in the mines, did you ever
- hear of any problems, low air on the sections or
- longwall?
- 17 A. There were problems on the section and always
- 18 changing air on the section.
- 19 Q. So they always had air problems?
- 20 A. I mean, I never worked up there, just from hearing
- 21 people talk.
- 22 Q. They would talk?
- 23 A. Yes.
- Q. Did they get a lot of tickets because of that?
- 25 A. I don't think too many. I don't know how many ---

- 1 they was always getting some kind of order --- written
- 2 up for something.
- Q. When inspectors would be getting ready to come in
- 4 the mines, would you guys know that they were getting
- 5 ready to come in?
- 6 A. Not until they was in there.
- 7 Q. Not until they was in there.
- 8 A. I didn't anyways, because I worked outby.
- 9 Q. Did you ever hear anybody hollering on the phone,
- saying there was an inspector coming in?
- 11 A. No.
- 12 Q. So ---.
- 13 A. Of course, a lot of times when the inspector would
- get there, we went --- had already seen him out there
- 15 yet.
- Q. So you knew he was in the parking lot, you knew he
- was coming?
- 18 A. Right.
- 19 Q. You knew he wasn't there just to sit around?
- 20 A. Right.
- Q. Do you know if this mine ever mined through a gas
- 22 well anywhere ---?
- 23 A. Not that I know of.
- Q. Did anybody ever talk about the Little Eagle Seam
- 25 with you, underlying Eagle Seam?

- 1 A. Uh-uh (no).
- Q. Nobody ever discussed the seam of coal under you?
- 3 A. They did once talked about --- a long time ago
- 4 they said they might try to mine --- eventually mine
- 5 it, but that was it.
- 6 Q. Nobody ever discussed any problems resulting
- 7 from ---
- 8 A. No.
- 9 Q. --- the Little Eagle Seam of coal?
- 10 A. No.
- 11 Q. What about methane outbursts? Did you ever hear
- of anybody talk about them or do you know anything
- 13 about them?
- 14 A. No, sir. No, I don't.
- 15 Q. What about problems with excessive water?
- 16 A. Well, just behind the wall and stuff, we were
- 17 constantly trying to get pumps down there. And they
- 18 had a crew on the tailgate side all the time to check
- 19 the panels.
- 20 Q. What kind of pumps did they use? Did you ever
- 21 help set those pumps?
- 22 A. No, sir, I didn't help set them.
- 23 Q. Did you ever hear anybody from management say
- 24 anything about the water?
- 25 A. Just said if they didn't get pumped out, the

- inspectors would shut them down.
- Q. Okay. What about gate roads, did you ever hear of
- 3 any water on the headgate section or the tailgate
- 4 section?
- 5 A. No, sir, not just --- besides the normal water
- 6 behind the wall.
- 7 Q. You never heard of any water up here on Dino's
- 8 section?
- 9 A. No, sir.
- 10 Q. Now, you mentioned you shoveled belt outby. Were
- 11 there --- anybody pre-shift those areas before you
- were working?
- 13 A. What do you mean as a pre-shift?
- 14 Q. Before you go in and work in that area, somebody
- 15 has to examine that area for hazards.
- 16 A. I guess they did. I mean, ---
- 17 Q. Anybody ever go ---?
- 18 A. --- fire bosses would go in.
- 19 Q. Did anybody ever talk to you about what they
- 20 found?
- 21 A. No, sir.
- 22 Q. Were there any hot spots along the belt?
- A. As in --- you mean coal or ---?
- Q. As in spots that had either fallen out or had been
- 25 mined so high that you couldn't ---?

- 1 A. No. It was pretty ---.
- 2 Q. Even around the belt heads you could hold your
- 3 head up and get up to the roof? You could hold your
- 4 hand up with a spotter and get up to a foot of the
- 5 roof?
- 6 A. Oh, yeah. Yeah.
- 7 Q. So you had high spots there?
- 8 A. Yeah, I guess.
- 9 Q. Did they have a probe or anything to be able to
- 10 extend a methane detector up?
- 11 A. I have no idea.
- 12 Q. No idea?
- 13 A. I don't know.
- Q. You know methane gathers in those high points, ---
- 15 A. Right.
- Q. --- and that's the reason why you say you've got
- to get your detector up within a foot of the roof,
- 18 so ---. The continuous miners in this mine, now they
- 19 were equipped with methane detectors; right?
- 20 A. Yeah, I quess. I mean, I don't know too much
- 21 about the miners.
- 22 Q. Did you ever hear of anybody bridging one out or
- otherwise disabling the methane monitor?
- 24 A. No, sir.
- Q. Okay. What about on the longwall?

- 1 A. No, sir.
- 2 Q. Did you ever hear of anybody disabling it in any
- 3 way?
- 4 A. No.
- 5 Q. Did anybody ever discuss the approved methane dust
- 6 control plan with you?
- 7 A. Yeah, they'd read that over. I guess that's what
- 8 it was.
- 9 Q. Did anybody ever discuss any changes they were
- 10 getting ready to make? I may have already asked that.
- 11 A. As in air or ---?
- 12 Q. Yeah, air changes. They were getting ready to
- make an air change. Did they go over it with you?
- 14 A. No.
- 15 Q. Okay. Let's go back down to that area that you
- were working in just inby the Ellis Portal. Now, you
- had one miner there cutting a belt channel; right?
- 18 A. Yes.
- 19 Q. Did you have another continuous miner sitting
- 20 around in there anywhere? Did you see them take one
- 21 in?
- 22 A. Not that I saw, no. I know there was the bolter,
- there was that miner and then we had the scoop.
- 24 That's --- as far as I know, that's all that was in
- there. I just don't pay attention to stuff like that.

- 1 I mean, ---.
- 2 Q. You just go in and do your job ---
- 3 A. Yeah.
- 4 Q. --- and expect everybody else to do theirs?
- 5 A. Yeah. I just --- yeah.
- 6 Q. When that miner was cutting down there and cutting
- 7 that belt channel, do you know if he was running his
- 8 scrubber?
- 9 A. I don't even know what a scrubber is. I hear
- 10 people talk about it all the time, and like I said, I
- 11 went over to Hunter Peerless, and this is the first
- 12 time I've been on --- actually worked on a section.
- 13 Q. Do you know anything about --- have you ever been
- 14 underground when a citation has been issued by an
- 15 inspector?
- 16 A. When they've written somebody --- not around them.
- Q. Not around when they've written anything. Do you
- 18 come outside after one's bee issued?
- 19 A. Yeah.
- 20 Q. Have you ever been --- have you ever had to be
- 21 withdrawn from the mine because of a citation being
- 22 issued?
- 23 A. I think there was a couple times they pulled us
- out over the air, I think it was.
- Q. What did management have to say about that?

- 1 A. We all went home, so I didn't really ---.
- 2 O. When was that?
- A. Oh, probably the first part of last year maybe.
- 4 Q. Do you remember any other times that you had to
- 5 come outside?
- 6 A. Just when the fan went off.
- 7 Q. When the fan went off? Did you ever have a shift
- 8 canceled due to an unsafe condition?
- 9 A. No. Like I said, just whenever the fan or
- 10 something went off.
- 11 Q. Do you know if anybody ever had any --- expressed
- any concerns for safety considerations in this mine or
- any hazards in this mine or they filed a complaint?
- 14 A. No.
- 15 O. You're not aware of that?
- 16 A. No.
- 17 Q. Did you ever have any concerns?
- 18 A. No. I mean, like I said, I trusted the guys I
- 19 worked with. I mean, Marvin, he wasn't over us, but
- 20 you know, he had been in it for 30 years and I trusted
- 21 him. I went to church with him, so he wouldn't have
- done nothing --- he wouldn't have done anything stupid
- 23 --- he wouldn't have --- if it was unsafe, wouldn't
- let us go in.
- Q. You mentioned a little earlier that they had some

- 1 ventilation problems on the working section.
- 2 A. You hear that they had that all the time.
- 3 Q. Do you know when these started?
- 4 A. It was there from the time as far as I can
- 5 remember. I mean, always complaining about not enough
- 6 air or --- up in the face or ---.
- 7 Q. And who did that complaining?
- 8 A. Just everybody, I guess.
- 9 Q. Did you ever talk to anybody specifically that you
- 10 can remember that had a complaint?
- 11 A. No.
- 12 Q. Do you know if the carbon monoxide system ever
- went into alarm or alert status while you were working
- in the mine?
- 15 A. As far as I know, no.
- 16 Q. Do you think there was a lot of pressure to run
- 17 coal at this mine?
- 18 A. Yeah.
- 19 Q. Why? What makes you say that?
- 20 A. The way they was pushing people to get stuff done
- and --- I mean, Everett, the superintendent, he didn't
- 22 have control of that mine for months. Wayne Persinger
- was pushing everybody to get stuff done. When we were
- working up there, he was pushing about those Kennedy
- 25 panels and pushing everybody to get stuff done.

- 1 Q. And who would he push?
- 2 A. Just I guess Everett and us and telling us we need
- 3 to hurry up and it had to be done at a certain time,
- 4 and they were running behind and just stuff like that.
- 5 Q. Nobody ever went over the plan with you guys as to
- 6 what you were supposed to be doing down there, as to
- 7 what the ventilation plan was, what was ---?
- 8 A. No. They went down and marked it and they marked
- 9 the ribs or the openings where they wanted the ---
- 10 now, Marvin and them might now, you know, but I
- 11 just ---.
- 12 Q. You were just doing what you was told to do?
- 13 A. Yeah, pretty much.
- Q. Do you feel like this pressure may have caused
- people to take shortcuts, maybe not all the time ---?
- 16 A. Maybe not all the time, but yeah, some, I guess,
- especially on the longwall, cutting them new channels
- 18 and stuff for it.
- 19 Q. Now, what do you mean? Let's talk about that.
- 20 A. They was always --- I mean, because they said they
- 21 was always behind and stuff on cutting the panels.
- 22 Q. Now, who was they would say they were always
- 23 behind?
- A. Just different people. I mean, you'd hear
- 25 different people talking about it.

- 1 Q. Did you ever see Chris Blanchard or Jason
- Whitehead in the mine?
- 3 A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Where did you see them at?
- 5 A. Just going down --- I'd pass them or something
- 6 going down towards --- you know, they would be in
- 7 there and they would just go inby different places.
- Q. Did you ever see them over in the area of the
- 9 mini-panel where you guys were working?
- 10 A. Yeah, I did one time, when we first started. They
- 11 was walking down --- actually, they was coming out as
- 12 we was going in.
- Q. Did they stop and talk to your crew or anything?
- 14 A. No, we didn't talk to them. I mean, I didn't know
- who they was at the time, and Mike told us who they
- 16 was. I still ain't for sure if I'd know Blanchard if
- 17 I saw him today.
- 18 Q. What about Chris Adkins and Don Blankenship, did
- 19 you ever see them at the mine?
- 20 A. No, sir.
- Q. Now, you mentioned earlier that when they were
- 22 cutting that belt channel that there was dust over in
- 23 the beltline where you were working and air was going
- inby that day?
- 25 A. Right.

- 1 Q. So in order for that dust to go over into the ---.
- 2 MR. STEFFEY:
- 3 Can we roll that map back out?
- 4 BY MR. STEFFEY:
- 5 Q. And we're talking about this area here that you
- 6 circled, area worked. Now, if they're cutting that
- 7 belt channel, and I know that belt channel was right
- 8 in here, just inby these doors, that first set of
- 9 double doors; right?
- 10 A. I think, ain't for sure, they was coming across
- 11 here, this way right here.
- 12 Q. Yeah. But in order for this air to get over into
- this belt air course and be dusty where you were at,
- 14 how did that happen?
- 15 A. Buddy, I don't know. I mean, like I said, I mean,
- 16 I don't know. All I know is they just told me to go
- shovel belt that day, and Five Head, wherever it's at,
- 18 I mean, from Five Head down, I mean, --- I thought
- 19 they might have dusted that night, but you could --- I
- 20 mean, you could just feel the air coming ---.
- Q. You could feel it coming in?
- 22 A. Yeah.
- Q. Okay. That was --- when I first saw, that was my
- 24 first opinion, they dusted.
- Q. Do you know anything about a ventilation change

- that was made over the weekend prior to the explosion?
- 2 Did you hear anything?
- 3 A. Just rumors that they went in and changed --- I
- 4 heard there was a roof fall and that's why they
- 5 changed the air.
- 6 Q. Where was there a roof fall?
- 7 A. I don't know. That's just stuff you hear.
- 8 Q. Did you hear anything about how they changed the
- 9 air ---
- 10 A. No.
- 11 Q. --- or what they did?
- 12 A. No.
- 13 Q. Okay.
- 14 MR. STEFFEY:
- 15 Do you have any follow-ups, Terry?
- 16 MR. FARLEY:
- 17 Yeah, a couple, three.
- 18 EXAMINATION
- 19 BY MR. FARLEY:
- Q. You said earlier that you helped build some
- 21 Kennedy stoppings back here around the Bandytown
- 22 fan ---
- 23 A. Right.
- 24 Q. --- like late 2009?
- 25 A. Just whenever they first stuck the fan in, yeah.

- 1 Q. Okay. Now, if you look at this map around the
- 2 Bandytown fan, it shows some permanent stoppings in
- 3 place at various places. When you built those Kennedy
- 4 stoppings back there, did you build them in locations
- 5 like you see here where the stoppings were going to
- 6 be?
- 7 A. Yeah. It was actually like --- kind of like, you
- 8 know, ---.
- 9 Q. It goes around?
- 10 A. Yeah.
- 11 Q. Okay. Now, were you back around that area this
- 12 year any time?
- 13 A. No, sir.
- Q. Did you ever work with a guy named Michael
- 15 Williams?
- 16 A. Yes, sir.
- 17 Q. Okay. When did you last work with Mr. Williams?
- 18 A. Let's see. They stuck me on second shift, I
- 19 guess, probably the first part of this year. And when
- 20 I went back they stuck Mike --- I think they stuck him
- 21 with Jaybird.
- Q. Who is Jaybird?
- A. He's the one that checked the pumps.
- O. Is that Burdoff?
- 25 A. Yeah, Burdoff. I'm trying to think if I worked

- 1 with him any. I guess that's --- well, we worked on
- the belt, the longwall belt together, but I ain't
- 3 really for sure.
- Q. But oh, let's say, a few --- a week or two or
- 5 three before the explosion on April 5th, do you know
- 6 if Mr. Williams would have been working with Burdoff
- 7 at that time?
- 8 A. I really ain't for sure.
- 9 Q. Last count you had on him, he was working with
- 10 Burdoff?
- 11 A. Yeah.
- 12 Q. You said earlier that Mike Kiblinger was your
- 13 mentor?
- 14 A. Right.
- 15 Q. Was he just your mentor when you started there or
- 16 was he your mentor ---?
- 17 A. Just when I first started, I guess, up until I got
- 18 my black hat.
- 19 Q. Now, I think Mr. Kiblinger may have had a crew
- down here at this Mother Drive construction area, down
- 21 here at the mouth of 22 Headgate?
- 22 A. Right.
- Q. Did you do any work in that area?
- A. Yes, sir, that's when we helped put the head in.
- Q. Okay. When was the last time you were in that

- 1 area?
- 2 A. Let's see. I'm going to say probably sometime in
- 3 March, early March maybe.
- 4 Q. Okay.
- 5 A. Maybe late part of it. Just --- I mean, one day I
- 6 would be there and the next day I would be somewhere
- 7 else.
- 8 Q. They moved you around?
- 9 A. Right.
- 10 Q. Didn't you have to cut a belt channel or something
- down here, too?
- 12 A. Yes. Yes, sir.
- 13 Q. Okay. Now, when you were working around that
- area, did you notice stoppings gone, knocked out,
- holes in them, doors open, anything like that?
- 16 A. Well, there was one set when you first went in
- 17 that we took out and then they stuck back and you
- 18 stuck back in and you took out. We had the stoppings
- 19 --- I really ain't for sure about this map. This is
- the belt channel. I really ain't for sure where we
- 21 are.
- 22 Q. The Mother Drive construction area would be around
- that area, around 130 there?
- 24 A. Yeah. And then there should be another set of
- doors. We stuck a new set in here and they came

- 1 across the track and put another set of doors ---
- well, the old set of doors that was there, that was
- just pretty much tore up, you put them there.
- 4 Q. Did you hear of anybody on 22 Headgate complaining
- of air problems while you guys were working on that
- 6 Mother Drive construction site?
- 7 A. No. No.
- 8 Q. Okay.
- 9 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 10 Beth?
- 11 MS. SPENCE:
- 12 No.
- 13 MR. STEFFEY:
- 14 I guess it's back to me. Do you got
- anything, Bob?
- 16 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 17 No.
- 18 RE-EXAMINATION
- 19 BY MR. STEFFEY:
- 20 Q. When you were working right in here, do you ever
- 21 remember your eyes burning?
- 22 A. No.
- Q. And when I say right here I mean at the mouth of
- 24 22 Headgate.
- 25 A. Right. No, not that I can remember. I get

- 1 heartburn and stuff.
- Q. Did anybody complain of their eyes burning?
- A. No, not as far as I know of.
- 4 Q. What about the men working on the 22 Headgate, did
- 5 you ever hear them complain that their eyes were
- 6 burning?
- 7 A. No.
- 8 Q. Back down in that area that you circled area
- 9 worked, when that miner was cutting there, the miner
- has got to have water on it; is that correct?
- 11 A. Yeah, I guess. I don't know.
- 12 Q. Do you know where that water source came from?
- 13 A. No, sir, I don't.
- 14 Q. Did you help put the water up to the miner when
- 15 they put it in there?
- 16 A. No, sir, I did not.
- 17 Q. Okay.
- 18 MR. STEFFEY:
- 19 All right. I think I'm --- I don't have
- anything else.
- 21 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 22 Before we finish, let me mark the map
- 23 that we were referring to as Exhibit Athey Three.
- 24 (Athey Exhibit Three marked for
- 25 identification.)

- 1 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 2 If there's nothing further, Mr. Athey, on
- 3 behalf of MSHA and the office of Miners' Health,
- 4 Safety and Training, I want to thank you for appearing
- 5 today and answering our questions. Your cooperation
- 6 is very important to the investigation as we work to
- 7 determine the cause of the accident. as I indicated
- 8 earlier, we will be interviewing additional witnesses,
- 9 so we ask that you not discuss your testimony with
- 10 anyone.
- 11 After questioning other witnesses, we may
- call you if we have any follow-up questions. If at
- any time you can think of any additional information
- that you think would be helpful to our investigation,
- please contact either MSHA at the contact information
- that is provided or the contact information that Terry
- 17 provided you for the State.
- 18 I want to --- I do want to remind you of
- 19 your rights under the Mine Act. You're coming in and
- 20 talking with us today is considered protected
- 21 activity. If anyone takes any adverse action against
- 22 you, discrimination or anything like that, as a result
- of your cooperating with this investigation, you
- should --- you're encouraged to contact MSHA and file
- a complaint under Section 105(c) of the Mine Act. And

- 1 you can do that by contacting the MSHA district office
- in Mount Hope. And as I indicated earlier, you can
- 3 find additional information concerning your rights
- 4 under the Mine Act at MSHA's website, www.msha.gov.
- 5 Before we finish, I do want to give you a
- final opportunity. If there's anything else that you
- 7 feel would be helpful or anything else that you would
- like to add to the record, you may do so now.
- 9 A. I don't have anything.
- 10 ATTORNEY WILSON:
- 11 Okay. Again, I want to thank you for
- 12 your cooperation in this matter, and we'll go off the
- 13 record.
